PROJECT OVERVIEW

The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga traces its roots to 1886, at a time when the City of Chattanooga had a population of 30,000. It joined the University of Tennessee system in 1969 and is known for a number of nationally ranked academic programs, including the undergraduate Business, Engineering, Chemistry, and Nursing programs; as well as the highly-regarded Master's program in Industrial and Organizational Psychology and the PhD program in Computational Engineering.

The City and The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga have nurtured each other's growth and prospered from the other just as they generate benefit. Now with a population over 180,000, Chattanooga's nickname is the "Scenic City," evidenced by the numerous options for outdoor activity that many UTC students enjoy. Somewhat conversely, Chattanooga also goes by "Gig City" for having internet speeds of up to 10 gigabytes per second, provided by the city-run Electric Power Board, the first municipally-owned utility company to do so.

The symbiosis between the University and the City is no more plain than in the realm of Athletics. Finley Stadium was built in partnership between the City, University, and the people of Chattanooga. Almost 40% of Finley's cost came from private donations. Football game attendance is dominated by the non-student citizens of Chattanooga. The Mocs play in the Southern Conference and have been named one of the top 100 Athletic programs in the country by The National Association of Collegiate Director's of Athletics.

The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga' has an opportunity to improve all Athletic Programs by realizing a near-term plan that is the opening, enabling move in a sequence of possible improvements. 

The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga is a driving force for achieving excellence by actively engaging students, faculty and staff; embracing diversity and inclusion; inspiring positive change; and enriching and sustaining our community.

CONTEXT

The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga is the city of Chattanooga's and southeastern Tennessee's premier university with an enrollment of over 11,000 in the fall of 2018. The Mocs play in Division 1 (Football Championship Subdivision) of the NCAA and is a member of the Southern Conference. The Mocs athletic programs support 15 male and female intercollegiate athletics programs and have enjoyed success across many different sports over an enduring timespan.

The Mocs Football Team plays it's home football games at Finley Stadium - an off-campus 20,000 seat stadium that is twenty years old. The team practice and operations facilities are located in McKenzie Arena on the UT - Chattanooga main campus. The team has two practice fields at the Murphy-Haugerud Football Practice Complex at Scrappy Moore Field. Neither field is full size and the site is north of campus, requiring players to walk to the site from McKenzie Arena for practice. In the last several years the practice fields have also endured several flooding incidents. The team will practice at Finley Stadium on occasion as well.

FACILITY DOCUMENTATION

The spirit of Mocs Athletics is not being met with commiserate facilities. The efforts conducted to ensure operation of University Athletics' teams have been ingenious and well-intended but the current conditions would not be replicated in a new facility. In 2009 and 2010 the consulting firms of Michael Brady Inc., and Pickering updated the facility assessment for all University buildings. At that time, McKenzie Arena was recommended for a Major Renovation and graded as needing "Potentially Critical Improvements." The 10 years since that declaration have been difficult for this building that originally opened in 1982. It is a tribute to the coaches and University officials that McKenzie serves so many groups as well as it does but intervention is overdue.




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3.1 PROGRAM SUMMARY

PROGRAM SUMMARY

The growth of Athletic Facilities at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga has occurred organically over the last 130 years. Industrious efforts to accommodate growth efficiently and with available resources has resulted in a current situation that, without intervention, represents a choke point for continued growth. The Mocs' facilities and the manner the teams must operate within them are being eclipsed by peer institutions. The Program herein outlines a Football Training Facility attached to McKenzie Arena that moves the almost one-third of all UTC student athletes that is the football team out of their current location to a home that will improve operation and recruiting efforts of the football team while simultaneously realizing the same for soccer, golf, men's and women's basketball teams and the athletic training space for all student athletes.








OPEN OFFICE LAYOUT HEAD COACH OFFICE SUITE LAYOUTS




SMALL STAFF MEETING ROOM 383 SF SEATING FOR 10




LARGE STAFF MEETING ROOM 698 SF SEATING FOR 16+




TEAM MEETING ROOM LAYOUTS



SMALL TEAM MEETING ROOM 263 SF SEATING FOR 10




MEDIUM TEAM MEETING ROOM 341 SF SEATING FOR 16





4.1 GENERAL + APPLICABLE CODES

CONCEPTUAL DESIGN DESCRIPTIVE NARRATIVE

- A. The University of Tennessee Chattanooga desires to make renovations and additions to McKenzie Arena which primarily include the construction of a football training facility. This project includes new and renovated spaces including football locker rooms, maintenance areas, clubs, restrooms, athletic training areas, equipment rooms, coaches locker rooms, basketball locker rooms, football administration, and team meeting rooms.
- B. This section describes the general expectations of the Heating, Ventilating, Air Conditioning (HVAC), Electrical, Plumbing, Telecommunication, Fire Protection, and Architectural systems necessary to support this type of project.
- C. All references to equipment sizing are based upon preliminary design estimates and are subject to adjustment as the design progresses.
- D. In addition to the requirements listed in this narrative, the proposed renovations and additions to the facility shall comply with the current University of Tennessee Designers' Manual (including all appendices), Guidelines, and Standard Specifications.


4.2 CIVIL + UTILITIES

This narrative is provided to discuss the site work that will need to be completed for the addition of the Athletic Training Facility to McKenzie Arena.

All items listed below are based on renderings, floor plans, survey information, and utility information provided to us to date.

Site Grading

The area selected for the building addition is a relatively flat area with a somewhat level plane from the building (Level 2 elevation) to East 5th Street. To the north of the building addition are the main steps to the arena and, per the renderings, the steps will end at the outside wall of building addition. To the south, the grade drops off to the existing service drive that ties into Level 1 of the arena. Depending on the width of the addition, a foundation wall or site retaining wall might be needed along the south side of the addition if the addition conflicts with the slope down to the existing service drive.



Storm Water Management

Per the renderings, it appears that the land disturbance will be less than one acre in area. In that case, storm water detention will be required to detain the peak storm events, as well as treating the runoff. An underground detention system with a water quality structure would be the most simplistic option, but a bioretention area, or rain garden, could also be utilized and that could add some aesthetic appeal to the outside areas around the building addition. The runoff from the site would either enter the City's storm system at the corner of East 5th Street and East 4th Street (shown as red/brown lines in the photo below), or the City's combined sewer system (shown as pink lines in the photo below).

Additional storm water detention systems could also be considered for this project in an effort to reduce the runoff load on the City's existing drainage systems, which at times become overwhelmed and surcharge out of structures that serve UTC's properties and facilities.

4.2 CIVIL + UTILITIES

Utility Services

Sanitary sewer, if not connecting to the existing services inside the arena, will be able to connect to the City's combined sewer system in East 5th Street. Alternately, it could connect to the City's sanitary sewer system (shown as green lines in the photo above) at the corner of East 5th Street and East 4th Street.

Domestic water and fire protection services, if not connecting to the existing services inside the arena, will be able to connect to a public water main in East 5th Street (see below photo).

Electrical services, if not connecting to the existing services inside the arena, should be able to tie to existing electrical services in East 5th Street. Currently, there are existing transformers/electrical equipment in the vicinity of the new building addition. This equipment, as well as the electrical services and conduit that run from the equipment to the arena, might need to be relocated depending on the footprint of the building addition and surrounding hardscape areas.

For a previous campus project, a section of high temperature hot water and chilled water utility lines was abandoned. This section of abandoned piping is roughly in the area south of the building addition, between the building addition and the existing driveway serving Level 1 of the arena. This piping varies in size from 5" to 10" piping, and might be encountered during construction.



4.2 CIVIL + UTILITIES

Site Demolition

The existing concrete steps to the main entrance of the arena will be removed and replaced with new steps and a series of planters. A driveway and small parking area (Level 2 elevation) on the south side of the existing steps will be removed as they conflict with the new building addition. Several trees in the vicinity of this driveway and parking area will also need to be removed. Additionally, the City of Chattanooga will require this existing driveway curb cut be abandoned and new curb and gutter and sidewalk installed in the right-of-way. As previously mentioned, some existing electrical equipment might need to be relocated based on the building addition footprint and surrounding hardscape areas.

The City of Chattanooga requires that new projects repair or replace the existing concrete sidewalks and curb and gutter fronting the project in the City's right-of-way. It will need to be determined during the design phase if the sidewalk and curbing along East 5th Street will need to be repaired or replaced. Additionally, if utility services cross the centerline of East 5th Street, the City will require a 20' wide section of asphalt pavement to be repaved at these utility service locations.

Site Improvements

Care will need to be taken that the pedestrian walkways from the new building addition to the City's right-of-way are ADA accessible. New ADA ramps might also be required at driveway and road crossings.

Currently, the street section from the sidewalk to the centerline of East 5th Street includes a bike lane and two traffic lanes, with two traffic lanes on the opposite side of the centerline traveling in the opposite direction. If any other option is considered, for example a drop-off lane in front of the arena or widening the sidewalk along East 5th Street for increased pedestrian capacity, then that work will need to be coordinated with the City of Chattanooga. Additionally, we recommend having discussions with the City of Chattanooga early in the design process to coordinate with them on any potential roadwork projects they are considering that might impact the Athletic Training Facility project.

4.3 SUSTAINABILITY

ARCHITECTURAL CONSIDERATIONS

The University's commitment to sustainability is evident in ongoing UTC Recycling programs. Building renovations shall utilize the methods listed below to conserve energy and control cost in support of UTC's sustainability goals while also adhering to the State of Tennessee's High Performance Building Requirements.

ENERGY CONSERVATION AND SUSTAINABLE DESIGN

- A. The project shall incorporate, to the greatest extent possible, the State of Tennessee Sustainable Design Guidelines, noted as Appendix 2 of the University of Tennessee Design Guidelines, referenced by the High Performance Building Requirements.
- B. The building envelope materials and mechanical equipment shall be provided in compliance with ASHRAE Standard 90.1-2010 for Climate Zone 4A for demonstrating compliance with the energy code. The building HVAC and lighting systems will be designed to be as energy efficient as possible while keeping maintenance, cost, and layout in mind.
- C. The goal of the project shall be a significant reduction in building energy consumption, from historic data, through the innovative use of "on-demand" control technology, high efficiency mechanical equipment, and other energy saving methods. The noted mechanisms leverage current technology to exceed industry standards. This system represents the balance point between controlling both operating and construction costs.

Energy Saving Methods Utilized

- a. Natural Ventilation, eliminates the need for energy intensive mechanical ventilating.
- b. Enthalpy Airside Economizer Cycle allows for reduced mechanical cooling requirements by utilizing cooler outdoor air temperatures when available. Based on project location mechanical cooling can be reduced over 80% of the year utilizing airside economizer.
- c. Demand Control Ventilation (DCV) reduces system outside air ventilation requirements during low occupancy periods while still maintain acceptable indoor air quality.
- d. Variable speed pumping for hot water and chilled water systems provides for reduced system energy usage during off-peak periods.
- e. Variable Speed Chillers, allows for turndown/load matching to maximize system efficiency and reduce system energy usage.
- f. Variable Speed Fan Motors, reduces fan power during off-peak periods.
- g. Duct static pressure reset and supply air temperature reset, reduces system energy usage during off-peak periods.

SITE CONDITIONS AND FOUNDATIONS

Foundations

It is expected that spread footings will support the steel columns and concrete walls. The largest typical footings are anticipated to be approximately 12'-0" x 12'-0" x 2'-4".

Lateral Load Resisting System

We anticipate the building will be laterally supported with 8"-thick concrete shear walls that form the stair and elevator towers.



Elevated Floor Slabs and Roof

The elevated floor slab will be framed with steel beams and a composite concrete deck. We anticipate using a 6-1/2" semi-lightweight concrete slab (3.5" slab on 3" metal deck). The concrete will have a specified strength of 3,000 psi, a unit weight of 120 pcf, and an air content of 4% to 7%. The metal deck should be 20 gauge. This configuration will provide a 2-hour fire rating in accordance with UL Listing D916.

The third and fourth floors will have clear span 60 feet with 33" deep wide flange members or 40"-deep castellated beams spaced at 10'-0" on-center.

The second-floor beams will be W16 wide flange purlins at 10'-0" center-to-center, assuming columns can be spaced at 30'-0" on-center.

The third floor below the plaza will be framed with 18" steel wide flange beams and a composite metal deck. We anticipate the plaza will include a 4"-thick topping slab over a drainage mat.

The roof will clear span 60 feet and be framed with 30"-deep bar joists spaced at 10'-0" on-center supporting a 3"-deep, 22-gauge, galvanized metal deck.

Columns

The columns will be W12 steel wide flange shapes. We anticipate the largest column size to be a W12x72.

Concrete Strength

Footings 3,000 psi Interior Slab-on-Grade 3,000 psi

Hall of Fame Level 4

The existing floor will be extended along the perimeter with W16 steel beams connecting into the existing concrete column and beams. The floor will be a 6-1/2" semi-lightweight concrete slab on a 3", 20-gauge metal deck. The new glass and metal façade will be framed with vertical steel tubes.

Basement/Retaining Walls

The concrete walls below grade will be 16" thick on continuous spread footings.

1. PART 1 - GENERAL

- A. This document describes the general expectations of the Mechanical, Electrical, Plumbing, Fire Protection, Acoustics, Audio-Visual, Security, and Telecommunications systems for this project.
- B. Confirmation of existing utility capacities serving the arena will need to be verified to determine if they are sufficient to handle the renovation scope within the existing arena.
- C. Per discussions with the University, it is desired to re-use the existing arena infrastructure as much as possible. If it is determined there is insufficient capacity of existing utilities, then new services or upsized services will be required.
- D. It is anticipated the arena renovation and addition portions of the project will not require smoke control and stair pressurization systems. It is anticipated any existing smoke control and/or stair pressurization systems for the existing arena will not be affected by this project.

2. PART 2 - MECHANICAL

- A. The existing arena utilizes chilled water and heating water provided by campus utilities for mechanical heating and cooling.
 - 1. The renovated areas of this project within the existing arena footprint will utilize existing chilled water and heating water capacity from the arena. New piping, valves, and fully automated controls will be provided as necessary.
 - 2. The expansion areas of this project utilize existing chilled water and heating water capacity from the arena. New piping, valves, and fully automated controls will be provided as necessary
 - a) If it is determined there is insufficient capacity from the arena, then new chilled water and heating water capacity will be provided via new connections to the campus chilled and heating water systems. Coordination will be required with the University to determine connection locations to the campus systems.
 - 1) Two new chilled water pumps will be provided for the chilled water system.
 - 2) Two new tube and shell heat exchangers and two new heating water pumps will be provided for the heating water system.
 - 3) The chilled water and heating water systems will each include valves, air/dirt separator, expansion tank, pumps, variable frequency drives, modulating control valve, and fully automated controls.
- B. The renovated areas and expansion areas of this project will utilize new air handling units for space conditioning. Each air handling unit will be provided with airside economizer for 100% outside air economizer. Anticipated Air Handling Unit Schedule is s shown on the next page. Final equipment quantities and capacities will be determined during design upon completion of building load calculations.

- C. Heating and/or cooling of the hydrotherapy pool water will be coordinated with the pool consultant and desired pool manufacturer.
 - 1. Cooling will be provided either water cooled chiller, or heat exchanger connected to building chilled water system.
 - 2. Heating will be provided via electric water heater or shell and tube heat exchanger connected to building heating water system.
- D. Hydrotherapy rooms will each be provided with a separate dedicated dehumidification unit rated for pool environments. Dehumidification units will utilize chilled water and heating water.
- E. A computer room air conditioning unit will be provided for the video server room.
- F. Fan coil units or split DX, at owner's discretion, will be provided for mechanical, electrical, tele/data rooms, A/V rooms, elevator equipment rooms, and other similar spaces.
- G. General exhaust systems will be provided for toilets, janitor closets, break rooms, and other areas requiring exhaust.
- H. The project will be provided with a fully automated Building Automation System (BAS) with Direct Digital Control (DDC) for all HVAC equipment. The BAS system will be coordinated with the University and will be based on campus standard controls vendor and tie into the campus wide loop. The BAS system will include a front-end graphics based system.

3. PART 3 - ELECTRICAL

A. Electrical Services

- 1. The existing arena is served by a 1500kVA utility transformer served from the University's campus utility loop at 12,470V. The utility transformer serves 480V, 3-phase power distribution to a 2500A main switchboard located in the southwest quad at the ground level. The existing arena electrical service shall be upgraded to serve power distribution to the renovated areas located within the existing arena footprint and the new expansion area. It is anticipated the upgraded electrical service shall be sized to provide 4000A, 3-phase.
- 2. Emergency and standby power will be provided by a new 100kW, 480V, 3-phase diesel generator located outside the new athletics facility to serve new elevators, sump pumps, and emergency lighting.
 - a) Provide alternate option to increase the existing generator to serve both the existing arena and this project. Existing generator capacity will need to be field verified to be able to support additional load.

B. Power Distribution

- 1. It is anticipated the renovated areas of this project within the existing arena foot print will utilize the existing power distribution where possible.
- 2. Normal power distribution for the expansion area will be distributed from the upgraded arena 3-phase main switchboard to remote 480/277V distribution panels and transformers for 208/120V electrical loads located in the expansion area.
- 3. Emergency power distribution for the expansion area will be served by a new ATS and 480/277V distribution panel that will serve remote 480/277V panels and transformers for 208/120V electrical loads. A tap connection enclosure and manual transfer switch will be provided upstream of the new ATS for a temporary alternate source of power for generator maintenance and downtime per latest code.
- 4. All wiring devices (receptacles, switches, etc.) for renovated and expansion areas will be new.

C. Lighting Systems

- 1. Lighting Fixtures
 - a) All lighting will be LED, with possible exception for accent lighting, with space illumination levels designed per recommended illuminations levels by the latest IES Lighting Handbook.
 - b) All lighting fixtures for renovated and expansion areas will be new.

4. PART 4 - PLUMBING

- Plumbing Utilities
 - 1. Existing
 - a) The existing arena is served by a 6" domestic water line that enters the building at the north west mechanical room. Parallel reduced pressure zone backflow preventers are located on the service line with the building. A domestic booster pump is provided within the mechanical room to serve the entire arena
 - b) The existing arena is served by multiple sanitary sewer lines that exit underground and connect to the site sanitary sewer system.
 - c) The existing arena is served by multiple storm sewer lines that exit underground and connect to the site storm sewer system.

2. New

- a) The renovated and expansion areas will be served by the existing water, sanitary, and storm utilities from the arena.
 - (1) The existing domestic booster pump will be replaced and upside as required to serve the existing arena and new renovated and expansion areas.
- b) If the existing water, sanitary, and storm utilities within the arena are insufficient to serve this project, then new services will be provided.
 - (1) A new domestic water service will be provided to serve the new expansion areas and any renovation areas located in the existing arena that cannot be served by the existing domestic water system. New parallel reduced pressure zone backflow preventers will be provided within the building on the service line. It is anticipated that a new domestic water booster pump will be required.

- (2) A new sanitary sewer exit will be provided to serve the new expansion areas and any renovation areas located in the existing stadium that cannot be served by the existing sanitary sewer systems. The new sanitary sewer exit will leave the building below ground and connect to the site sanitary sewer system.
- (3) A new storm sewer exit will be provided to serve the new expansion areas. The new storm sewer exit will leave the building below ground and connect to the existing arena storm system upstream of the existing pumping station. The existing storm main from tie-in point to the pumping station will be increased in size as necessary.

B. General

- 1. The domestic water and sanitary sewer systems will be sized to handle "Super Flush" conditions.
- 2. Floor drains will be located in each toilet room (approximately one floor drain for every six water closets or urinals) and in each mechanical room.
- 3. Freeze proof wall hydrants will be located on the exterior of the building near each entrance or at a maximum of every 200 feet.
- 4. Simplex elevator sump pumps with oil sensing switches will be provided in each elevator shaft.
- 5. It is anticipated that sump pumps will not be required and that all systems will be gravity drained. Portions of the sanitary or storm systems which cannot gravity drain to the site sewer systems will be served by duplex sump pumps. Sump pumps will be provided with high level alarms connected to the fire alarm system.

C. Domestic Hot Water

1. Existing

- a)The existing arena domestic hot water requirements are served mainly by a high temperature hot water to domestic hot water heat exchanger located in the north west mechanical room.
- b) Additional remote water heaters are provided as needed in the arena.
- c) Per University discussion, two 100 gallon electric water heaters are used for backup water heating and must be maintained. Any new domestic hot water service must tie into the header served by the backup water heaters

2. New

- a) The existing domestic water heating systems will be replaced and upsized as if necessary to serve the existing arena new expansion areas and any renovation areas located in the existing stadium.
- b) Domestic hot water will to be heated to 140 degrees. Point of use thermostatic mixing valves will be installed for break room sinks, lavatories and hand sinks.
- c) Per University discussion, replace two 100 gallon electric water heaters with new 100 gallon water heaters for backup water heating.



D. Plumbing Fixtures

- 1. Water closets will be floor mount with 1.28 GPF manual flush valves.
- 2. Urinals will be wall hung with 0.125 GPF battery powered sensor operated flush valves.
- 3. Lavatories will be wall hung (with floor mounted carriers) or counter mount with 0.5 GPM faucets. Faucets will be single handle manual type in locker rooms and family toilets. Faucets will be battery powered sensor operated type in all other restrooms.
- 4. Showers will be ASSE 1016P pressure balance type. ADA showers will be provided with fixed heads, diverter valves, and hand showers.

5.PART 5 - FIRE PROTECTION

- A. Fire Sprinkler
 - A sprinkler system will be provided/extended throughout all new and renovated areas in accordance with the requirements of the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 13, the International Building and Fire Codes and University of Tennessee at Chattanooga standards.
 - A fire alarm system will be provided/extended throughout all new and renovated areas in accordance with the requirements of the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 13, the International Building and Fire Codes and University of Tennessee at Chattanooga standards.

6.PART 6 - ACOUSTICS

- A. Space programming and owner expectations will dictate final design recommendations. General expectations and recommendations are provided below.
 - 1. Room Acoustics
 - a) Sound absorbing material is critical for speech intelligibility, AV systems performance, and overall aural comfort. Plan for efficient sound absorbing material (min. NRC-0.75) to encompass at least75% of the ceiling area, allowing space for drywall bulkheads used for concealing ductwork and other building system elements. Acoustical wall panels may also be recommended for echo control in some spaces.

2. Sound Isolation

a) To provide speech privacy and sound isolation from adjacent spaces, minimum STC-47 partition construction is recommended. In order to achieve this minimum STC rating, walls are required to extend full-height to structure and penetrations through the wall must be sealed airtight with acoustical sealant. Any return air paths would need 1" lined sheet metal boots, and transfer ducts into corridors and other areas would need to be Z- shaped.

a) The building will require mechanical noise control measures throughout to ensure ambient noise criteria are achieved which will be provided for each space later in the design process. Typical mechanical noise control measures include duct silencers, internal duct liner, and vibration isolation mounts and hangers.

- B. Coordination with owners and stakeholders will drive additional design elements as project progresses. Systems designed will be based on the latest standards for proximity card readers and will maintain compatibility with current UTC card technologies. Design shall also meet all university requirements while extending owners existing systems, to be monitored by the campus communications center.
 - 1. Access Control points (card readers) will be considered for all mixed-use areas, where multiple user types of the building could interact, to prevent unauthorized users from entering restricted areas.

- Video Surveillance System shall provide both live and recorded high quality images to assist security staff in providing access, assessing alarm situations, providing general surveillance, and to facilitate forensic investigations of security events.
 - a) Cameras shall be placed in a manner to watch common corridors and Access Control points throughout the new addition. Design to be provided by owner during design.
 - b) Cameras will be considered for areas of high-value asset storage, entry points, elevators and outdoor public spaces.
 - c) All exterior entry doors will be provided with an interior camera.

9. PART 9 - TELECOMMUNICATIONS

- A. It is anticipated the renovated areas of this project within the existing arena foot print will utilize the existing voice/data ports where possible.
- B. Voice/Data/Wi-Fi for the expansion area will need to be distributed from a new Telecom Room or distribution point if the area is over the 290' from an existing telecom room. The new Telecom Room would be a minimum of 80 sf with a fiber connection back to the existing Main Telecom Room in the facility. Build out (racks, backboard, grounding bar, cable tray, wire management, patch panels, cabling, etc.) of the Telecom Room would be per University Standards.
- C. All voice/data wired devices for renovated and expansion areas will be new.

SUBJECT: Executive Group Meeting

- v. Populous will look at aligning the equipment room with direct adjacency to football locker room.
- vi. Populous will examine moving training room to vacated women's basketball locker room area.
- Chancellor Angle asked why Populous was presenting an option differentiated from DH&W's scheme developed several years ago.
 - Populous understood our directive is to examine the conceptual design while creating an aligned program document that meets Tennessee requirements for building programming.
 - ii. Dr. Angle expressed a preference for a building mass perpendicular to the arena similar to DH&W's scheme, as the presentation differs from what donors have previously seen.
 - iii. Populous to revise the program layout to more fully align with DH&W's previous scheme.
- Populous had removed several spaces as a first pass at reducing the program to match the budget; spaces
 that were removed were then discussed by the group.
 - Dr. Brown indicated the football team meeting room is to be new and be available for academic use.
 - ii. Dr. Brown also emphasized the ability to show donors what they have seen previously (DH&W Scheme). There was indication that a list of spaces exists that indicates already secured commitments from donors. Populous requested this list.
 - Populous will review all spaces with athletics to ensure their needs are met within the project scope.
 - iv. Kenny would like Populous to show a range of numbers for price/sf moving forward.
- d. Populous reviewed the 2/26 Arena master plan presentation.
 - i. Scott recommended removing kitchen.
- e. Moving forward Populous will modify the plans to reflect a layout similar to DH&W.
 - i. Athletics and Populous met directly after to review program.
 - The University will provide a list of required spaces linked to donor commitments / needed for campus.
 - iii. Populous will revise plans upon confirmation of program spaces from the University.
