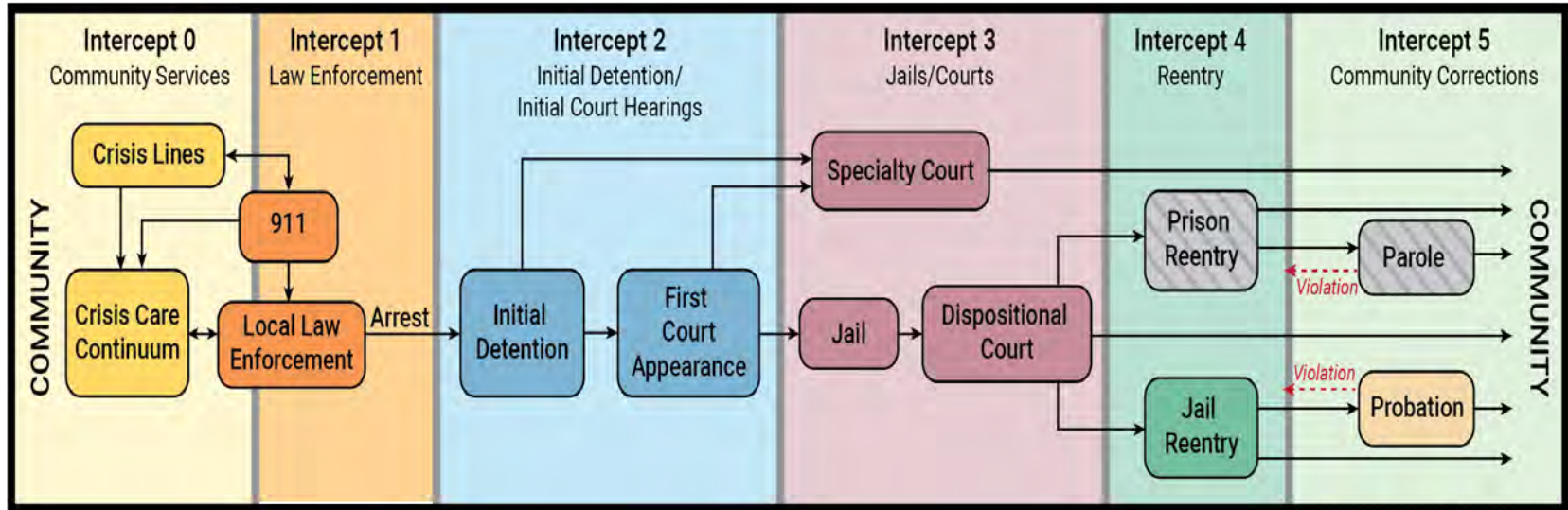

Sequential Intercept Mapping

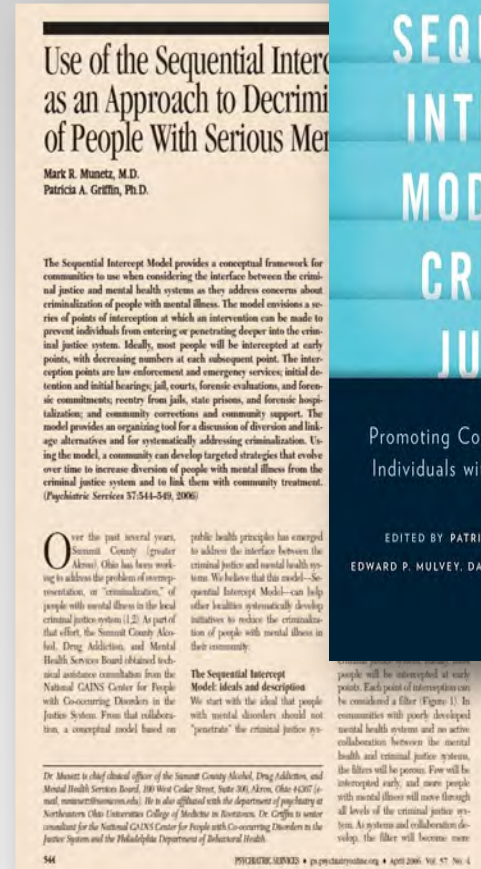
A tool for

- Planning and implementing services
- Identifying collaborative efforts
- Identifying resources and gaps

Purpose

- Review resources and gaps
- Summarize gaps
- Identify priorities for change

- People move through the CJS in predictable ways
- Illustrates key points, or intercepts, to ensure:
 - Prompt access to treatment
 - Opportunities for diversion
 - Timely movement through the CJS
 - Engage community with resources

 - Serious mental illness
 - Co-occurring substance use disorders
 - Involved with the criminal justice system OR at risk of involvement

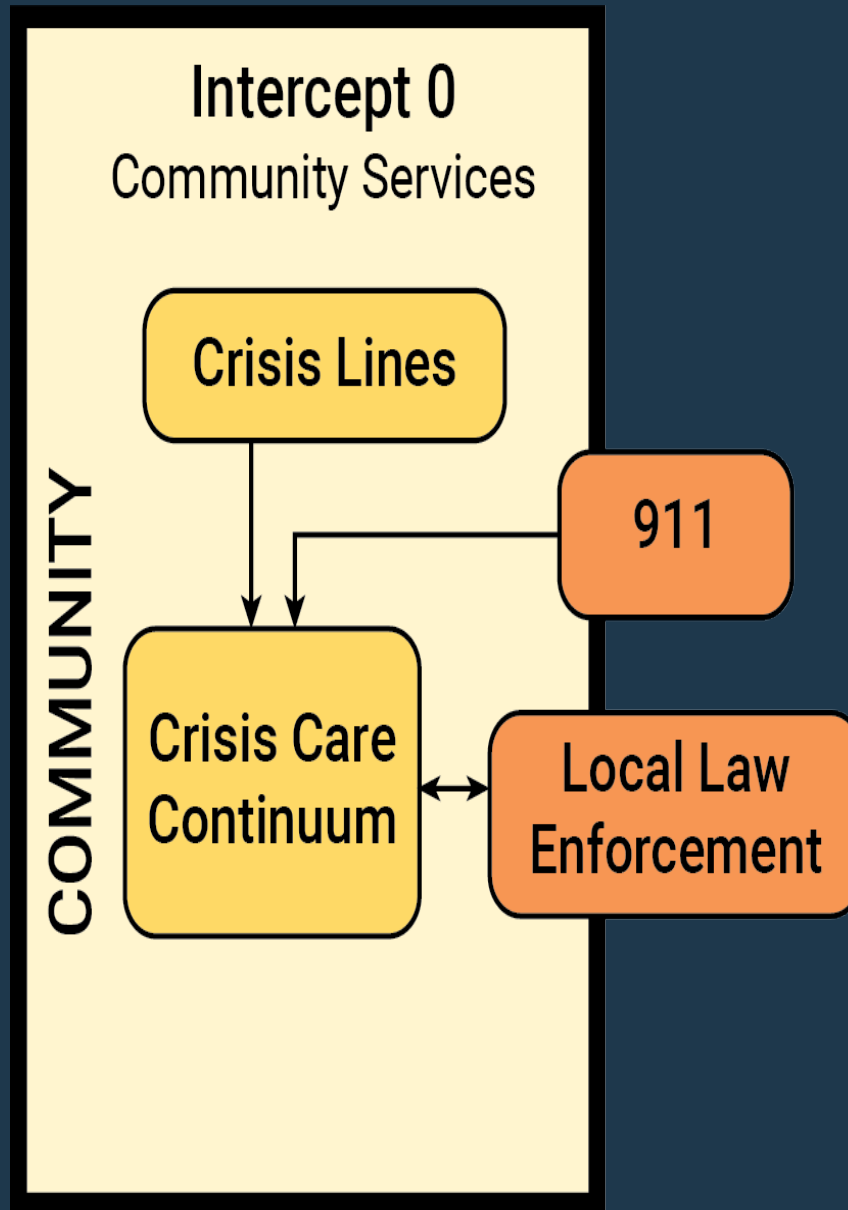

Six Key Points of Interception

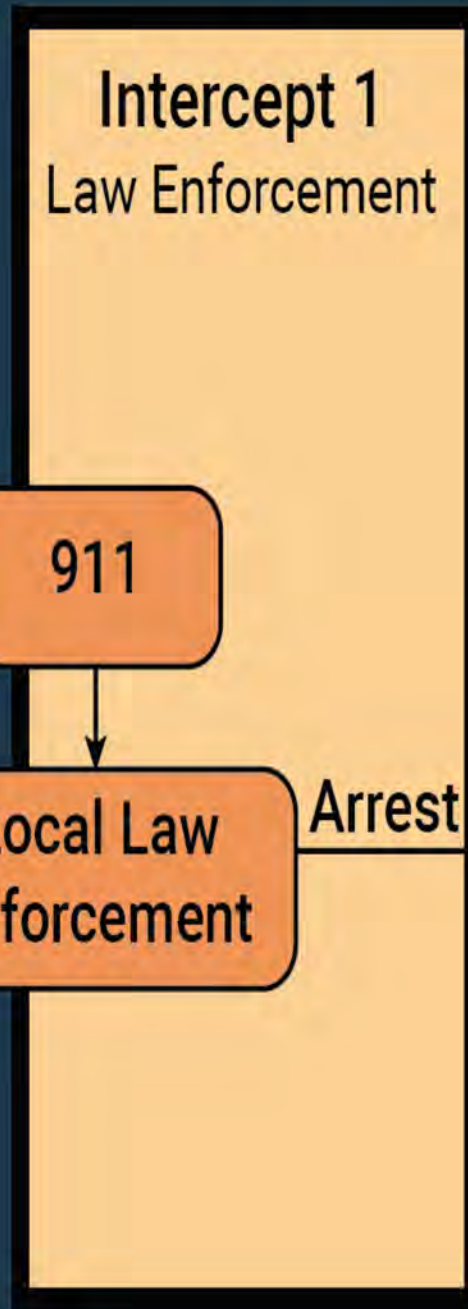
- Community Services

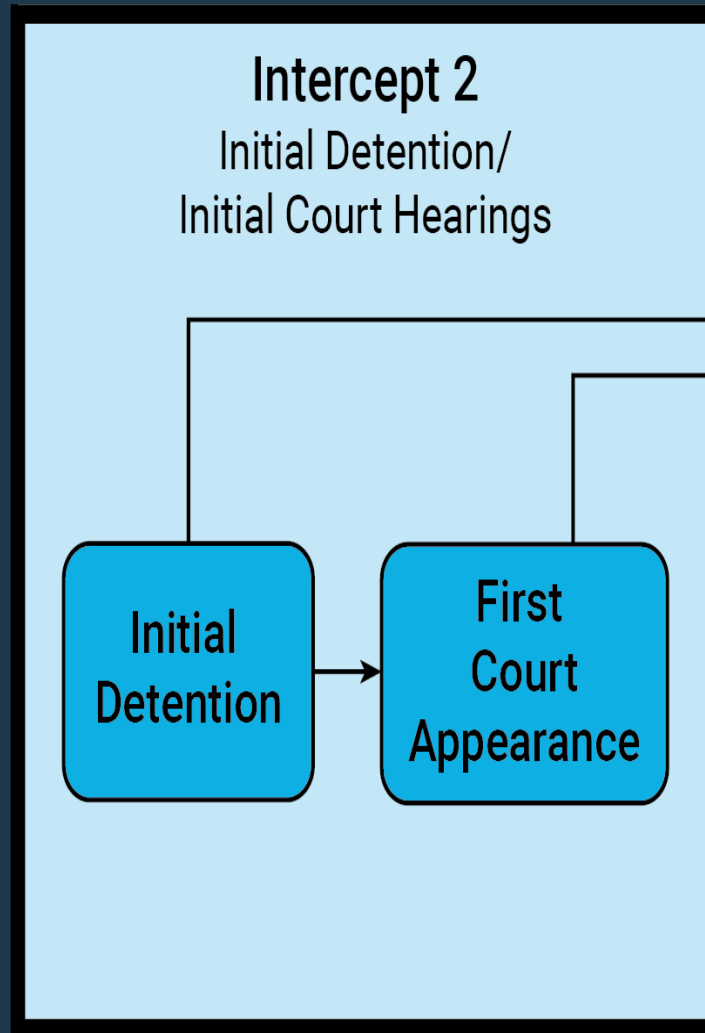

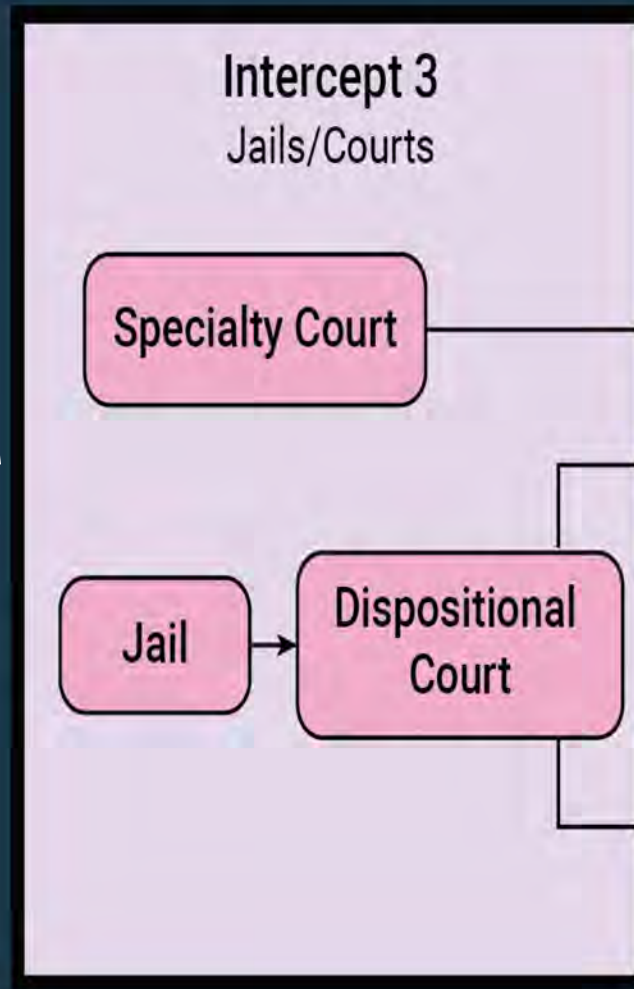


Intercept 2

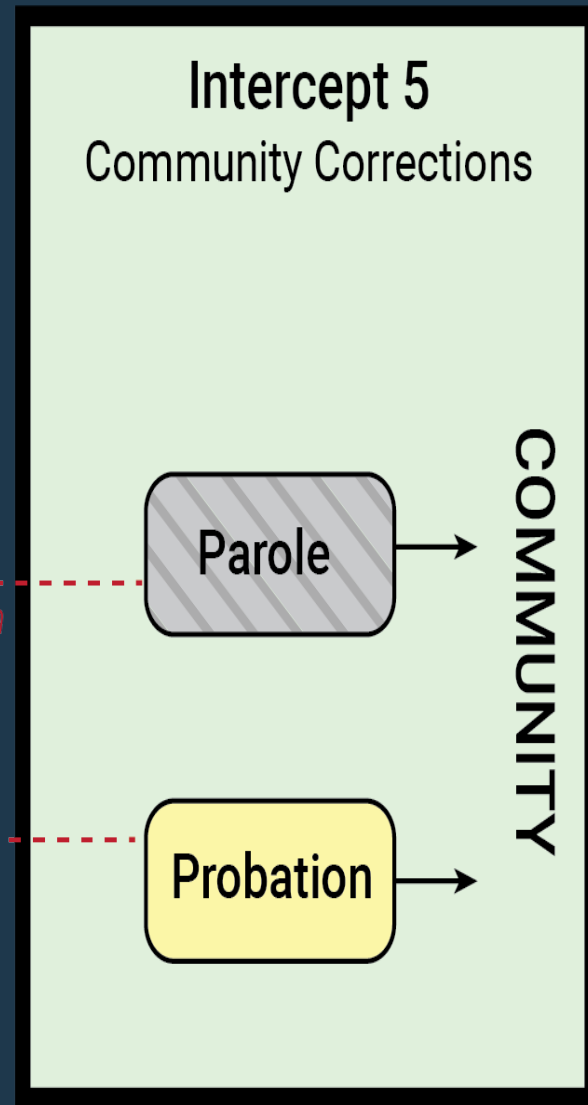
